


Gettysburg National Cemetery

Gettysburg, Pennsylvania Saturday, November 21, 2020

To honor the sacrifice of those who fought so bravely on these and more distant fields, the 18th annual Remembrance Day Commemoration takes place virtually with a reading of the names of the fallen Civil War soldiers. This solemn commemoration is a testament to those soldiers' efforts and their place in American history.

Gettysburg, Pennsylvania

A few months after the Battle of Gettysburg, a "soldiers' cemetery" was established to properly bury Union soldiers who had died during the fight. Ground for the cemetery was chosen near the center of what had been the Union Army's line of battle from July 1-3, 1863, and Pennsylvania Governor Andrew Curtin supported the proposal by providing state funds to purchase the ground and pay for the reinterment of the Union dead (from inadequate gravesites scattered throughout the fields). President Abraham Lincoln participated in the dedication of the new cemetery on November 19, 1863, just a few months after the battle. The words he spoke, while brief, would help redefine the nation and would reverberate throughout history as "The Gettysburg Address". The cemetery was finished in 1872 and turned over to the care of the Federal government. In 1933, cemetery care was transferred from the War Department to the National Park Service. Today the Gettysburg National Cemetery at Gettysburg National Military Park is the final resting place for more than 3,500 Civil War veterans as well as veterans from many of this country's major wars and conflicts.

The Gettysburg Address

"Four score and seven years ago our fathers brought forth on this continent a new nation, conceived in liberty and dedicated to the proposition that all men are created equal. Now we are engaged in a great civil war, testing whether that nation or any nation so conceived and so dedicated can long endure. We are met on a great battlefield of that war. We have come to dedicate a portion of that field as a final resting place for those who here gave their lives that that nation might live. It is altogether fitting and proper that we should do this. But in a larger sense, we can not dedicate, we can not consecrate, we cannot hallow this ground. The brave men, living and dead who struggled here have consecrated it far above our poor power to add or detract. The world will little note nor long remember what we say here, but it can never forget what they did here. It is for us the living rather to be dedicated here to the unfinished work which they who fought here have thus far so nobly advanced. It is rather for us to be here dedicated to the great task remaining before us - that from these honored dead we take increased devotion to that cause for which they gave the last full measure of devotion-that we here highly resolve that these dead shall not have died in vain, that this nation under God shall have a new birth of freedom, and that government of the people, by the people, for the people shall not perish from the earth."

Playing of Taps

Taps began as a signal for lights or lights out at the end of the day. For these purposes, there are no formal protocol procedures required. However, the playing of Taps continues to be a part of a military funeral/memorial honors ceremony. Upon hearing Taps at a military ceremony, proper protocol dictates those individuals in uniform render a salute until the music is complete. Civilians should remove their headgear and place their hand over their heart.
